**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course examines Canadian history from Confederation to modern Canada. The focus will be on the major social, economic, political and cultural developments as analyzed through the lenses of ethnicity, class and gender. Themes to be considered include: Confederation and nation building; urban and industrial growth; Canada and the World Wars; the Great Depression; and modern Quebec and Canada. These themes will be examined through lectures, course readings, presentations, and discussions.


