COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for speakers of non-Mandarin Chinese dialects to gain fluency in Mandarin Chinese through practice in listening, speaking, and reading. Students will be introduced to the pinyin orthographic system and will learn spoken Mandarin with emphasis on verbal communication and pronunciation using pinyin. Students will also learn the grammatical, syntactical, and structural differences between Mandarin Chinese and Cantonese. Students will further be expected to master the pronunciation and writing of key Chinese characters and essential Mandarin Chinese grammar.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Identify the Pinyin orthographic system as presented in Standard Chinese Course, Volume One, Book I.
- Learn spoken Mandarin with emphasis on verbal communication and pronunciation using Pinyin.
- Learn grammatical, syntactical, and structural differences between Mandarin Chinese and Cantonese.
- Understand and speak Mandarin.
- Master the pronunciation and writing of the key Chinese characters (in simplified form wherever applicable) and the Mandarin grammar as presented in Standard Chinese Course, Volume One, Book II.
