

## What is University Transfer?

University Transfer is when one post-secondary institution recognizes education completed at another. This means students can use the credits they earned at Coquitlam College to meet some of the requirements for a credential at other higher-education institutions across Canada. This also means they can begin their studies at another institution and use that credit to complete their Associate Degree at Coquitlam College.

At Coquitlam College, for students who complete studies in either Business, Arts or Science, transfer opens possibilities for them to complete their higher education degree at an institution to which they may not have been admitted directly. Students can complete one or two years of transfer credit courses in our pathway program, then transfer to a university or other institution of higher learning for their degree completion. Students can start their studies at another institution and continue their university transfer studies or finish an Associate Degree at Coquitlam College.

Since 1982, thousands of Coquitlam College students have begun their studies at Coquitlam College and eventually transferred to universities to finish their degree. Students who choose Coquitlam College to begin or complete their studies can take advantage of smaller class sizes and more affordable tuition fees while living in a safe, quiet neighbourhood. Education completed at Coquitlam College is recognized by other post-secondary institutions, not only in British Columbia but across Canada and into the United States.

Many of Coquitlam College's graduates have successfully transfered into universities in Canada as well as United States.



## **University Transfer Program**

## **ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE**

The Associate of Arts Degree requires students to complete a minimum of 60 credits of University Transferable courses, including 6 credits of English, 9 credits of Science, and 36 credits in Arts with 18 credits from second-year courses. This breadth of study allows graduates the opportunity to transfer into the 3rd year of a bachelor's degree at leading Canadian and American universities.

## **Benefits of an Associate Degree**

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- Associate of Arts Degree students are eligible to work off-campus on a part-time basis for up to 20 hours per week.
- ▶ Upon completion of the degree, full—time students are eligible to apply for a Post Graduate Work Permit (PGWP).
- After completing the first year of full-time work, graduates are eligible to apply for permanent residency.
- ► Some universities give priority admission to Associate Degree holders.
- ▶ British Columbia public research universities guarantee the full 60 credits to students admitted on the strength of an Associate Degree.



The Associate of Arts Degree is a two-year undergraduate degree. The Associate Degree program is designed to provide broad-based knowledge in the faculties of arts, humanities, and social sciences. Students will be challenged to develop their critical thinking and research skills, preparing them to enter the workforce, or as a foundation for further undergraduate study.

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## **University Transfer Program**

YEAR PATHWAY PROGRAM

**ARTS PATHWAY** 

Our one-year programs in arts, business and science are designed to give you a strong foundation in your intended area of study. For most university degree programs, your 1-year pathway will allow you to enter directly into your second year of study at the university of your choice.

All 1-year pathway programs require you to complete 30 to 31 credits.

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**SCIENCE PATHWAY** 

The Arts Pathway is a one-year (30 credits) program in General Arts designed to provide students with a broad education in humanities and the social sciences.



- ► A CAEL score of at least 60
- ► A minimum score of 6.0 on the I.E.L.T.S. with 6.0 on the writing component
- ► An overall score of 60 on PTE with 60 on the writing component

### **ADULT GRADUATION PROGRAM**

- ▶ Thousands of Coquitlam College students have entered top universities using our First Track Program
- ▶ This program allows adult students a more concentrated course of studies, allowing high school completion in as little as one or two semesters
- ▶ Upon completion of this program, students receive a High School Graduation Diploma which is accepted for first year university studies at all public and private colleges in British Columbia
- ► Upon completion of first year at Coquitlam College, students may enter second year at top universities in Canada and the **United States**

Students who are 18 years of age or older may complete their high school requirements in the BC Adult Graduation Program. Students must complete five High School courses. Of the five courses:

- ▶ 2 of the 5 can be transferred
- > 3 of the 5 must be at the Grade 12 level
- ▶ Numeracy and Literacy Assessment are optional

#### **ADVANCED PROGRAM**

This program is for highly motivated and capable students under the age of 19 who want to begin their university studies as soon as possible.

Students in the Advanced Program must successfully complete four high school courses including English 12 and write the corresponding provincial exam. They may then begin university courses at the College after meeting the requirements.

Upon completion of at least 30 university course credits at Coquitlam College, students are eligible to enter a university at the second-year level.

Coquitlam College knows that strong English language skills are the key to reaching your academic and career goals in Canada and the United States. We offer a wide variety of English courses and immersion experiences for students of any level.

#### **ENGLISH CERTIFICATE PROGRAM**

The English Studies programs at Coquitlam College are for students who are looking to develop their language skills as they prepare for high school and/or university studies. The English Certificate Program is for all students who need to improve their English language skills.

Courses offered range in levels from beginner to university preparation. Students are required to take writing and reading in each level.

At the Intermediate and Advanced levels, students have four electives, from which they can choose two. These electives integrate all four skills (writing, reading, listening, and speaking) and focus on specific topics to allow students to use the skills they are learning.

#### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

Students must be at least 15 years of age when they begin their studies. In some cases, you will need to take the Coquitlam College English Diagnostic Test to find the best courses for your level.

#### **Beginner**

At the beginner level, students will be exposed to the fundamentals of English that will create the framework for future learning.

#### Intermediate

Intermediate students will build upon the framework they created in the beginner level to further develop the skills necessary for success in and outside of the English classroom. Reading comprehension and grammar will also be stressed. At the intermediate level, students may choose from the following electives:

- Canadian Culture
- Everyday English
- Media/News Studies
- Personal Awareness

#### Advanced

At the advanced level, students are prepared for the transition to secondary level courses in an English language environment. Emphasis is placed upon clear and fluent communication and on writing essays at the secondary level. Advanced students may choose from the following electives:

- College Communication
- Media Production
- Social Topics
- World Culture
- University Preparation
