COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is an introduction to the Chinese language for students with little or no background in the language. The concept of pinyin Romanization is introduced; grammar is emphasized, and the study of both the traditional and simplified forms of the Chinese writing system is begun. The course also offers an introduction to the spoken forms of Chinese necessary to carry on conversations in daily situations.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- To introduce students to basic Chinese with emphasis on verbal communication and pronunciation using pinyin system.
- At the end of this course, the students should master the pronunciation, meanings, and writing of the key Chinese characters (both the traditional and the simplified forms wherever applicable) and Chinese grammar used in lessons 1-15 of Practical Chinese Reader Book I.
- To familiarize the students with some aspects of Chinese culture.
