Pathways to UBC Philosophy Major

Lower Division Requirements

- Students majoring in Philosophy must take at least 42 approved credits in Philosophy (or accepted equivalent courses), including at least 30 upper-level credits, subject to the following requirements:
- Symbolic Logic: PHIL 220 or 222
- Value Theory: at least one of PHIL 230 or 330*
- Epistemology/Metaphysics: at least one of PHIL 240 or 340*

Summary

Coquitlam College offers the requisite courses to complete the lower division requirements for students seeking to complete a four-year Philosophy Major at UBC. We have received direct transfer credit for all lower division courses required. CC PHIL 220 – UBC PHIL 220, CC PHIL 221 – UBC PHIL 230, and CC PHIL 201 – UBC PHIL 240. Students can also take any of PHIL PHIL 100, PHIL 101, PHIL 200, PHIL 203, PHIL 250 as an additional lower division course to fulfil the 12 possible lower division philosophy courses.
