COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is an introduction to the Japanese language and is designed for students who have some knowledge of the Japanese language. The purpose of the introductory course is to give students a solid grounding in all four basic skills – listening, speaking, reading and writing. It will allow students to express simple ideas orally, listen and comprehend dialogue, develop basic skills in reading and writing the Japanese syllabary *Hiragana* and *Katakana* and a number of *Kanji*.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Master Japanese readings and pronunciation for a minimum of 145 basic kanji.
- Carry out a simple everyday conversation in Japanese. This will include expression of thoughts and opinions in casual form, reporting speech, talking about future plans and experiences, describing health and giving advice.
- Aurally comprehend basic discourse in Japanese.
- Recognize and become familiar with aspects of Japanese culture and society.
