COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course students will be offered the second half of a two-course sequence in French devoted to the continued development of oral and written expression and further knowledge of French culture.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Be familiar with the basics of French started in French 101 and be prepared for further language courses.
- Comprehend French readings and pronunciation based on chapter topics and vocabulary.
- Develop writing, using clear, simple sentences with vocabulary studied.
- Carry out a simple everyday conversation, progressing from simple one-word answers to speaking in longer, clearer, and well-constructed sentences using the vocabulary studied.
- Create dialogues using grammar points and vocabulary learned in each lesson. French grammar focuses on basic French grammar, present tense of regular er/re/ir verbs and main irregular verbs, as well as use of articles, prepositions, descriptive adjectives, possessive and demonstrative adjectives, interrogative expressions, the simple past tense, numbers, expressions for weather and basic French idiomatic expressions.
- Recognize and comprehend simple ideas and thoughts expressed in spoken French.
- Be familiar with some aspects of French culture and society.
